



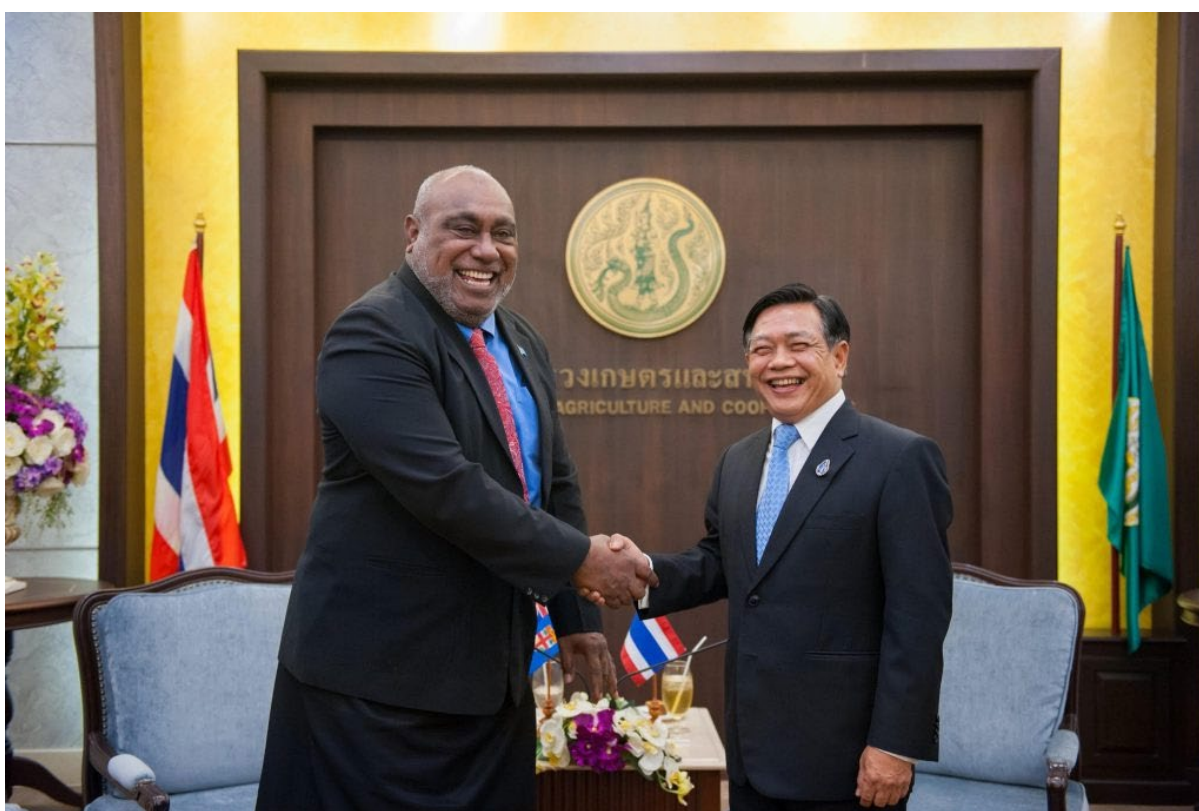

Fishery Cooperation between Thailand and Fiji

Thailand and Fiji joined hands in fishery cooperation to strengthen food security in both countries.



On 13rd November 2019 at the reception room of the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, Mr. Alongkorn Ponlaboot, Advisor to the Minister of Agriculture and Cooperatives and his entourage welcomed the Minister of Fisheries of Fiji Hon. Semi Koroilavesau and discussed to strengthen fishery cooperation between the two countries under the Memorandum of Understanding on Fishery Cooperation between the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives of Thailand and the Ministry of Fisheries of Republic of Fiji. Attendants also included Mr. Mesak Pakdeekong, Director-General of the Department of Fisheries.



Mr. Alongkorn Ponlaboot informed that Thailand was delighted to support shrimp farming and laboratory for water quality and aquatic animal disease analysis with a view to promoting food security in the Republic of Fiji. In addition, he was of the view that Thailand and Fiji could cooperate in investment in tuna fishing or other marine captured fisheries. Besides, the Thai side gave a high priority to countries in the Pacific Islands as they are endowed with significant aquatic animal resources especially tuna. Thailand imports more than 700,000 tons of tuna each year, therefore both countries should join hands in combating Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated fishing in order to protect and sustain these fishery resources.
